



This February we are going to teach the Simple Truth, “I Am Loved” with the Theme *Power Up*. Kids will love the fun old school video game art and graphics we’ll include each week. More than that, they will grow and be encouraged as we teach that God loved first, God loves best, God loves more, and God loves always.

**February 2:** God Loved First

**Bible Story:** God Loved Adam and Eve (Genesis 2–3)

Coming up this week, we will tell the story of Adam and Eve from Genesis 2–3. God made Adam and Eve, and He loved them. Even when they disobeyed God, He continued to love them. Kids can know that God loved us first, and as a result, even our wrong choices won’t make Him love us less.

**February 9:** God Loves Best

**Bible Story:** God’s Big Story (Genesis 1–3; Luke 2; Acts 1; Romans 5; Colossians 1)

Our Bible story this week is “God’s Big Story,” and we will teach kids that “God Loves Best.” We’re going to look at the overarching story of God’s love and plan throughout the Bible in Genesis 1–3, Luke 2, Acts 1, Romans 5, and Colossians 1. God always had a plan to show His incomparable love through His Son, Jesus, who came to offer us a relationship with God. Kids can know that God’s love is the best thing we could want and is the greatest thing we need.

**February 16:** God Loves More

**Bible Story:** God Loved His People (Judges 1–3)

This week we are teaching kids that “God Loves More.” Our Bible story will be from Judges 1–3. God’s people, the Israelites, got into the cycle of sinning and disobeying God, suffering as a consequence to their sin, and crying out to God for help. When they cried out, God sent *judges*, who were special leaders, to help His people turn back to Him. God showed His love over and over because God loves us more than our sin and wrong choices.

**February 23:** God Loves Always

**Bible Story:** God’s Love through Jesus (1 John)

As we finish up February, we are going to teach kids that “God Loves Always.” The book of 1 John, found in the second part of the Bible, teaches that God showed His incredible love for people by sending Jesus. When we repent and turn away from our sin, find forgiveness in Jesus, and commit to follow Jesus, we can live every day in His love. More than that, we know we get to live with God forever. God’s love is incomparable because He loves always.
