Discussion Guide

Prayer

• Share one high and one low from this past week. Take time to thank God for the good moments. Ask him to bring healing to the hard areas.

Introduction

• This week, we're exploring a passage that shows us Jesus' nearness and authority. He is the Christ, the anointed one, and he uses his power to heal.

MIRACLES

• Much of the culture in Jesus' time misunderstood his identity and purpose. What are common ways that our culture misunderstands Jesus?

Read Mark 8:22-26

- "Some people" brought the blind man to Jesus. We can be "those people" for others. What are practical ways that we can bring people to Jesus this week?
- What do you think this experience was like from the blind man's perspective?
- What does this section teach us about the character of Jesus?
- Using the blind man as an illustration, when has Jesus clarified your spiritual sight, like you were seeing a truth for the first time?
- "The fact that this miracle took place in two stages shows that Jesus' miracles are not formulaic and that healing can be a process. Perhaps Jesus used this miracle to show his disciples that their own "sight" was growing by stages." Rodney L. Read Mark 8:27-30

- How would you answer Jesus' question, "Who do you say that I am?"
- Pastor Blake taught us that "Christ" is not Jesus' last name, but his title. Using scripture, what is the significance of the title, "The Christ?"
- The most dangerous idol is believing in a false view of Jesus. Has an incomplete or inaccurate view of Jesus ever taken you off course?
- Who helped you understand the true identity of Jesus?
- How can we help our friends and family see the real Jesus rather than the Jesus of our natural assumptions?

- Each discussion guide this year will feature one of the scriptures' "one another" statements. These instructions guide us on how to love one another.
- Stir up one another to love and good works (Hebrews 10:24) this week, send each other texts and reminders to "stir up" love and obedience to Christ.
