


May Club 4-5 Take Home

Parables Series

Jesus had a great way of taking difficult truths and breaking them down in understandable and relatable ways. In practically every parable Jesus taught, we can find ourselves in one of the characters.

Week 1 – May 3

This week we are studying Luke 15:1–7 and focusing on the way that Jesus meets us where we are.

Questions to ask in the car or around the table

- In what ways do you see people acting like they are better than others?
- How should we think and feel about the fact that even though we cannot save ourselves, Jesus can?
- What does it say about the character of God that he would go through so much to save sinners?

Week 2 – May 10: No Small Groups – students will attend worship service with their families.

Week 3 – May 17

This week we are studying Matthew 25:14–30 and focusing on how to manage our God-given gifts to be used in God’s Kingdom.

Questions to ask in the car or around the table

- When have you seen someone use a gift that God has given them for the good of others?
- What gifts has Jesus given for you to serve his Kingdom?
- How can you use those gifts to glorify God and love others starting today?

Week 4 – May 24

This week we are studying Matthew 18:21–35 and focusing on offering forgiveness and mercy to others.

Questions to ask in the car or around the table

- Why does forgiveness matter so much to God?
- Where do you need to extend forgiveness to someone else in your life?
- What steps can you take this week to become more generous with the mercy and forgiveness you show others, even when they are wrong?

Week 5 – May 31

This week we are studying Luke 10:25–37 and considering the needs of others above our own by serving others with love and humility.

Questions to ask in the car or around the table

- Who are the “neighbors” in your life that you often ignore or overlook?
- How could you be more loving to the people God has placed in your life?
- What does it mean to show “mercy,” and how can we better show it?
